Compromise:

- California enters as free state
 - Popular sovereignty in New Mexico territories
 - Smaller state of Texas
 - Texas debt repayment
 - Fugitive slave law
 - Abolition of slave trade in D.C.
 - Permanent protection of slave trade nationally.
